00:08:28:00 ATHINA: (holding birth chart) Look at how big the hand is actually at twelve weeks right here. They show you a lot of weird stuff in here. Yeah! (laughs) That’s like really weird.
INTERVIEWER: Are those eyes?
ATHINA: Yeah they’re eyes! (laughs) It’s like the heart from four to seven weeks. The brain. Look at the brain looks like a little - like a little string. From twenty-eight days to thirty-six days. The arm is just like a little nub at a time (laughs). Something weird, I don’t know.
INTERVIEWER: I like how they show the pregnant woman with the -
ATHINA: With the (laughs) with the little cigarette right here I don’t know that’s weird.
INTERVIEWER: Wait, can we get a shot of this then?

INTERVIEWER: We left during the gifts. But we wanted you to recap the, the games because it was really dark.

00:10:09:00 ATHINA: (Takes breath) Okay, um, during the games, the first game was the baby food testing game. We had all the boys do it. But, um, they weren’t having it (shaking her head “no”). No. Like, they like threw the food everywhere (laughs). And they were like, “No it got on my pants!” There was a lot of, um, well here, right there (pointing to photo). It got all over his beige pants, and it was like carrots, and he was having a fit cause he said he felt it on his pants. So, I don’t know. It was that and then... some other little game where you write down something, and they like had to do it, like crawl like a baby or something like that. I thought that was a retarded game, but, um, then there was the one about how big I was...um...Actually, the guys - two of the guys were like, “Oh no, I know how big she is, I know how big she is, I’m gonna get this right!” And they

actually got it right. And it was most of them too. Um, I took a picture with them (looking down at photos)... This one. (laughs) His eyes are closed in this one. But, um, no, they got that one right. I don't know. It's kind of weird.

ATHINA: That one I'm not sure about cause like everyone's gonna be like a lot older than me (laughs). But, I don't know, I'll probably... One of them's gonna be like "ohhhhh" and I (shakes head no)... I don't really like that, so, I don't know... Like, my aunt's like, "they're gonna be like "let me touch your stomach," And I'm like... I don't like that, so...

ATHINA: I don't - It's annoying. It really gets annoying. The first few times it's okay, but then like after awhile it really gets annoying. So...

INTERVIEWER: So, um, you were talking about how you're going to get in-schooled? Is that what you were telling your dad?

ATHINA: Oh yeah, I'm going to get home-schooled because, um, my school is pretty far away from our house, so, it's like, sometimes in the morning my uncle takes me, but then sometimes he can't take us so we have to go walking. And it's like I had to walk double - well not double but like two extra blocks (unintelligible) drop off my brother at school. And it's just really (shakes head) I just can't do it. I can't walk to school and then walk back from school cause it really makes my back hurt really bad. And then it's like, sitting in the chair all day is really uncomfortable, and, I don't know, it's just really becoming really uncomfortable for me. So, and my teachers like, you know, you go and get home-schooled. And, yeah, that's probably what I'll do (inaudible) next few weeks.

00:14:28:00 INTERVIEWER: What were you talking about when you, when you guys were at the party you were saying something about how like the school - you were gonna (unintelligible) school (unintelligible)? What was going

on? Do you remember, because I was like, oh, I'm like can you pull me out of school (unintelligible)...

00:14:45:00 ATHINA: Oh, I don't know, its just like everyone's fine with me being at the school except for like the social worker and the principal. And they want to like get out of the school, and my teacher's like, "you know, there's no point of it you know. There's nothing they can do about it." But like they, they just like, they just, they just hassle me about certain things and its...I really don't think I deserve that. I'm a good kid. I never got suspended, you know. I'm on honor roll, you know. But, they just - they're just not treating me right. And my teacher doesn't like it, and she's like, "don't let it get to you." So, I'm just not letting it get to me.
INTERVIEWER: What kind of things do they like - how do they hassle you?

ATHINA: Well, its just like little things, but like, like, like when, like I pass by them, they give me weird looks or like, they're always like, like before my mom went up to the school, they were telling me, "Oh you should go to an alternative school and blah blah blah. It's better for you." And like the alternative school is in a really bad neighborhood. Its like, its overcrowded for, first of all. And its just like really far away from the house, and I have no way to get there. Are they gonna send someone over to drive me over to the school or something? No. You know, I don't want to take the bus over there, because its in a bad neighborhood. So, um, they would just do stupid things like that.

00:16:14:00 INTERVIEWER: So are they the only people who are giving you problems?

ATHINA: Well, yeah, everyone, like the kids don't even care, cause like... No they don't even care, they - most of the kids - I get along with everybody in the school and so, its like, just them who are the only people giving me problems. So, I don't know.

INTERVIEWER: So, um, when is, like, after you have the baby are you going to be home-schooled still or are you going to go back?

ATHINA: Oh no, I get, um... its usually about six weeks, but if my doctor says longer, then I get longer. But, after that I go back. I get like about six weeks off and then I go back to school.

CRYSTAL (seated next to Athina): I basically just kept to myself. Sat in the corner and kept to myself. It was just like a regular teenager party. Got a little loud, you know. Especially with boys there. Got a little loud, but that was okay. A little longer than I wanted but, you know.

INTERVIEWER: What time did they end up leaving?

CRYSTAL: Around eight thirty. It was supposed to end at five, so you know around eight thirty. So...

ATHINA: It's today?

CRYSTAL: Uh-huh. I'm trying to look at it from their point of view, too. The mother approached me in a way that I did not like at all. It made it seem as if, if you're gonna call someone or something like this, you're not gonna tell, like she told me, 'oh well we gotta figure out who the father really is, so we're gonna have to do a paternity test because we don't know how many guys she's been with. 'Oh, nice to meet you, too! (laughs). I was like 'you don't know my daughter. I know my daughter, and I know who she's been with, and she's telling me she's been with this boy, and he is the father of her child.

just don't want to have to deal with that. But if it does come down to it, where they're like 'oh no the baby's gonna be with us' then we're gonna have to take it like that. But we'll see what happens.

If she gets accepted into one of the selective high schools, their curriculum is really hard. Is she gonna be able to handle that, is she gonna be able to handle a crying baby, waking up in the middle of night, studying for tests, you know, it's... I will be there for her, but, you know it's gotten to the point where I'm like, 'oh my God, should I just quit my job and just like do the baby-sitting myself so that she can finish,' but that's not even realistic because I need to work. I'm the only income coming into this household. And it's not easy just to leave somebody, you know, to leave your baby with somebody you don't know. You don't know

So we're trying to find somebody you know, that's responsible enough to take care of the baby, at least during the day. Another option I have is to change my hours. But then I would have to leave all three of them, my son, Athina and the baby alone from three to eleven or twelve o'clock midnight. Or three o'clock in the morning till, you know, whatever. And I don't wanna have to leave them like that. But that is a big issue for me, the babysitting. (inaudible) —enough of that, trustworthy people. But I mean, if we're able to do this, able to get a babysitter or someone to watch the baby. There's not

enough programs, I think. A lot of the programs that they have, are mostly based in really bad neighborhoods. I mean look at me, I'm thirty years old, I think ever since I had Athina I had dead end jobs or I've had jobs I shoulda cared and didn't. I'm thirty years old and starting over, ya know? Starting a job that I cared about and am concerned about, but I just hope the same thing doesn't happen to her. I hope everything turns out right. Only time will tell.
