EDITOR'S INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTEMPORARY ART PROJECT Revised 040207

BACKGROUND

This project involves an artist with an acute sense of contemporary anxiety, attempting to create work that taps into that anxiety. The artist is Kerry Skarbakka, a very well known and respected contemporary photographer. He straps himself into harnesses, stages "falls" and digitally erases the evidence of the harnesses. The prints are large digital prints.

In July, 2005, he staged an event at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago. He invited me to document the event. I did so. The footage includes rehearsals of his "falls", his being photographed by well known photographers Matt Siber, Brian Ulrich, Pulitzer-prize winner John White, etc., and interviews. One of the interviews was by Neil Steinberg from the Chicago Sun-Times. He excoriated Skarbakka in his review; that was picked up by the press in New York and by the governor of New York. People quickly jumped on the lynching bandwagon. Skarbakka event received death threats.
